SCHEDULING INFORMATION FROM OUR PRINCIPAL

We have completed the first semester of the 2011-2012 school year and are well underway with the second half of our school calendar. Students received their class schedules and are learning new expectations and routines of second semester classes. Additionally, our underclassmen have begun the important scheduling process for their 2012-2013 school year.

Scheduling classes at Indiana Area Senior High School is an exciting time for students. Students continue to work toward fulfilling graduation requirements while selecting elective offerings that enhance educational, vocational, or general interests. Our guidance counselors will meet with students and provide them with important information about course selections and the scheduling calendar. To maximize scheduling opportunities, it is very important to adhere to the following timeline for student scheduling:

After students electronically input their requests, we determine the numbers of sections of courses that are needed and will be offered to students. Additionally, materials and other resources are budgeted for the upcoming school year, and the building schedule is developed. We will identify and address student schedule conflicts that arise, and class sizes are balanced to ensure best allocations of our teaching and support staff.

As you can imagine the scheduling process of a student-request-driven program is a very important matter for us. Beginning in February and working throughout the second semester, we strive to provide our students with class schedules that best meet their educational needs and interests. To that end, we encourage you to work with your child and his/her guidance counselor to select relevant and rigorous courses for the upcoming school year.

It is no secret that school districts across the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania are faced with declining budgets and staff while the expectation is to do more with less; the effects of this situation can strain the capabilities to deliver a comprehensive educational program. We are not exempt from such challenges and are working toward becoming more efficient to meet the expectations that our school community has for us. Therefore, it is essential that we have the best information in a timely manner to serve our students in an effective manner.

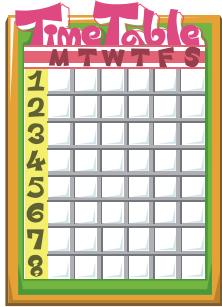

GUIDANCE NEWS

Student Scheduling for 2012-2013 School Term:

Students will begin to learn about next year's curriculum during the month of February. An orientation meeting for parents of incoming ninth graders has been scheduled for 7:00 p.m. on Thursday, March 8, in the high school auditorium. The Course Description book is available on the district website, www.iasd.cc, under the guidance link.

College Applications:

A note of "warning" to seniors who still have college applications yet to be submitted. The guidance office has learned that the number of applications that many colleges have received for the fall of 2012 has increased substantially. Many schools may be considering "cutting off" accepting applications far earlier than in past years. We have just heard from IUP that they are no longer accepting new applications for the Nursing and Speech-Language Pathology & Audiology programs.

Indiana University of Pennsylvania Acceptance:

Seniors who have determined that they will attend IUP in the fall should plan on attending one of the IUP Spring Freshman Orientation dates in order to have the best selection of course offerings at the university. **Also**, if your child would be interested in working full-time during the summer and continuing into part-time during the school year, they need to see Mrs. Allshouse in the Guidance Office. Several departments call us starting this time of

year looking for local students who are interested in jobs on campus.

Parent-Teacher Conferences:

Parent-Teacher Conferences will be held from 7:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. on Monday, February 20, 2012. Parents are encouraged to schedule conferences as soon as possible by phoning the guidance office at 724 463-3531.

Job Shadowing:

February has been designated as National Job Shadow Month. All students are encouraged to job shadow throughout the year with special emphasis in the month of February. A Job Shadow Permission Form can be obtained in the Guidance Office and is required to participate in this career exploration activity.

Financial Aid Night was held on Thursday, January 5. If you were not able to attend, the PowerPoint program is available on the Senior High Guidance website. An information packet was distributed that evening and is available in the Guidance Office.

Scholarships:

The guidance office receives information about many scholarships during the months of February and March. Please encourage your son or daughter to review scholarship offerings on a weekly basis in the Guidance Office or on the senior high guidance office website. ****The February scholarship memo will be the last one**

that is mailed home to parents. We will only distribute a memo to students in their English classes that can be brought home to you, the parents. As stated above, scholarships are also available on the website and are continuously updated.

The National College Fair

will be held at the David L. Lawrence Convention Center in Pittsburgh on Wednesday, February 8 from 9 a.m. until noon and from 6 p.m. until 9 p.m. and again on Thursday, February 9 from 9 a.m. until noon. Students planning to attend should pre-register at www.gotomyncf.com for a personal bar code to take with them to the College Fair. College reps will then be able to scan your bar code to automatically access your information. Students may stop in the Guidance Office for more information.

Standardized Testing:

Ninth grade students will be taking the Differential Aptitude Test and Career Interest Inventory during the school day on February 28. Results of both the Aptitude Test and Career Inventory will be reviewed with students in their English classes later in the school year and mailed home to parents at that time.

Cornell University Summer College Program:

Information is available in the Guidance Office for the Cornell University 3-week and 6-week summer college program for high school students. Interested students can obtain additional information as well as registration materials at www.summercollege.cornell.edu.

AP Exam Registration:

The 2012 AP exams will be administered May 7 through May 16. This year, students at the senior high will be registering online. This registration will take a few minutes and can be completed from any computer with internet access. Online exam registration began on **Monday January 23, 2012, at 7:00 a.m. and will end on Friday, March 16, 2012, at 3:30 p.m.** Students have already received information on how to complete the online registration in their AP classes. Each AP exam costs \$79. Students requiring financial assistance should contact Mrs. Smith in the Guidance Office to learn more about eligibility requirements. Registration is not complete until students have printed the pdf of the confirmation page that is provided at the end and submitted it along with payment to the Guidance Office.

ASVAB Testing:

Indiana Senior High School is offering juniors and seniors the opportunity to take the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) on Friday, February 17, 2012, at 7:45 a.m. in the Senior High School Library. Students interested in pursuing a career in the military are required to take the ASVAB prior to enlisting. However, the ASVAB is also useful in helping students who are not interested in military service to further explore their suitability for various career paths. Students who are interested in taking this test must register in the Guidance Office. There is no charge to take the ASVAB.

If you plan to participate in a spring sport and have participated in a fall or winter sport this school year, then you only need to complete a Re-Certification Form (section 5). **The re-certification form must be completed and turned into the nurse's office by Monday, February 27, 2012.**

If you have not participated in a fall or winter sport, please complete the Pre-Participation Physical Forms (Section 1-4). **If this is a new physical, it cannot be dated before Monday, January 30, 2012.**

All forms are available outside the nurse's office or forms can also be downloaded from the school district website – **click Senior High; click IHS Athletics; to the left of the screen look for Sports Physical Forms.**

Forms must be completed by a parent/guardian before you are able to participate or tryout for a spring sport. The official start date for the spring sports will begin on Monday, March 5. Senior High spring sports (grades 9-12) include: Baseball, Boys' Tennis Softball, Boys' Lacrosse, and Track & Field.
