## PARENT ALERT: PARENTS OF THE CLASS OF 2012

The Class of 2012 chose "2012: Saving the best for last" as their motto. The class song is "Good Riddance (Time of Your Life)" by Green Day.

### Senior Fundraisers

October brought with it the arrival of the senior class fundraisers. Your son or daughter will receive a sheet asking how he/she would like his/her fundraiser profit to be allocated. Fundraiser credits must be used for your senior's yearbook, cap & gown, graduation announcements or senior class trip.

### Graduation Announcements

In November, the senior class officers will meet with Mr. Dan Morgan from the Balfour Company to design the graduation announcements for the Class of 2012.

### Caps and Gowns

The caps and gowns that will be worn by the Class of 2012 will be of the same design as

we have used the last several years. The gowns for both males and females will be black with a single red stripe on the bottom of each sleeve.

On **Friday, January 6**, your son/daughter will receive information on ordering graduation announcements and caps and gowns. It is important that this information reaches you. Orders for graduation announcements and caps and gowns will be collected the following week on **Friday, January 13**, during Periods 2-5 in front of the cafeteria.

All orders for graduation announcements must be pre-paid. All checks or money orders for graduation announcements should be made out to **Balfour**. If paying by credit card, include your credit card number on the order form. Cost for the graduation announcements will be approximately \$1.25 each.

At the same time, seniors will order and pay for their caps and gowns. The cost of their cap, gown and tassel is \$22. Checks and money orders are to be made out to **Indiana Area Senior High School**.

Seniors will be permitted to use a cap and gown that was used during one of the recent years. This must be the black gown with the single red stripe on the bottom of each sleeve. New 2012 tassels will be sold for approximately \$5. If seniors have access to a gown worn by an older brother or sister or friend, and elect to wear a previously worn gown, they must indicate this on the form that they will receive at the January 6 meeting. This will need to be returned to Ms. Garbrick on January 13. No senior will be permitted to participate in the commencement ceremony for the Class of 2012 on June 5 unless they wear an approved cap and gown.

## WHEN DRIVING STUDENTS TO SCHOOL. . .

During inclement weather, many parents who have not previously driven their children to school may wish to do so. For the safety of all students, we request that parents dropping off students at the senior high please follow the procedures below.

1. When parents pull into the driveway from North Fifth Street, they are asked to turn right about halfway up the drive into the middle of the lower, "student," parking lot. (This is the middle

entrance to the lower or student lot.)

2. Drive through the lower lot toward the end of the lot abutting the gymnasium.
3. Please stay in the line. Students should exit the vehicle when the vehicle first comes to stop in the line of traffic and walk up the right hand side of the lot.
4. At the end of the lower lot parents will be directed back out onto the main driveway to exit the school grounds.

This procedure allows students to enter the school building safely, walking directly up the sidewalk and never needing to cross the flow of traffic. It also allows students to safely disembark from the buses at the front of the school building.

We thank parents and other drivers for their consideration and help in keeping our students as safe as possible by using these procedures for bringing students to school.



## COMCAST LAUNCHES LOW-COST PROGRAM

## GUIDANCE NEWS

### 9th GRADE ICTC TOURS

On December 1, 2011, all 9<sup>th</sup> grade students will be traveling to the Indiana County Technology Center to tour the various program areas. All students will need to bring a bagged lunch. If students wish to purchase a bagged lunch from the cafeteria, they will need to sign up in the Guidance Office no later than Tuesday, November 22. All students will be leaving immediately following homeroom period and will return in time for their 8<sup>th</sup> period class. We are looking forward to this exciting career exploration activity!

### SAT TESTING

Students who have registered to take the November 5, 2011, or December 3, 2011, SAT must report to their testing site no later than 7:45 a.m. on that date. Photo identification is required. If a student does not have photo ID, Mrs. Allshouse in the Guidance Office can provide it for him/her. Students should bring No. 2 pencils and a calculator to the test. The next SAT testing date at Indiana High School is January 28.

### SENIOR COLLEGE APPLICATIONS

Seniors need to be aware of college application deadlines for schools of interest and plan accordingly. Requests for transcripts from the high school guidance office must be made two weeks prior to the application due date. Keep in mind that Penn State's application deadline is November 30. Seniors need to check for application deadlines for any school to which they will apply.

### SENIOR SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

Seniors and their parents are reminded that an up-to-date list of general scholarship opportunities is posted on the Guidance Office website ([www.iasd.cc](http://www.iasd.cc); *Senior High; Guidance*). If not directed elsewhere, applications can be found in the Guidance Office. Timelines for applying for individual scholarships are important.

### NEWS FROM DUQUESNE UNIVERSITY

The guidance department was just informed that all current high school seniors accepted to the School of Education at Duquesne University will be given a 50% tuition discount beginning with the 2012 fall term. This tuition discount will only be for members of the 2012 high school graduating class and will cover their four years of study at Duquesne University. Students are encouraged to complete the application process prior to the end of November. Also, students applying to Physical Therapy, Physician

Assistant, or Pharmacy majors at Duquesne University have an application deadline of December 1.

### SOPHOMORE AND JUNIOR GRADUATION PROJECT

Counselors will begin working with 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> grade students on the applicable portion of their Graduation Project in their English classes during the months of November and December. The Graduation Project focuses on career exploration utilizing the Career Cruising website ([www.careercruising.com](http://www.careercruising.com)). Sophomores will complete a career interest inventory and learn methods of exploring specific careers while juniors will explore post-high school institutions that offer programs in a selected major course of study based upon a variety of options (type of school, location and setting, admissions difficulty, special program options, tuition/room and board costs, enrollment, activities, etc). Parents are encouraged to use the Career Cruising Program (Username : *indiana*; password: *senior*) as well as have their sons or daughters share the information that they discovered in their search.

## ATHLETIC NEWS

REMINDER: Winter sports physicals MUST be completed and returned to the school nurse before November 18, 2011, the official start date of the winter sports season. Students ARE NOT PERMITTED to practice or participate unless the appropriate physical forms are completed.

Students who plan to participate in a winter sport for the 2011-2012 school year must have their **PIAA Comprehensive Initial Pre-Participation Physical Evaluation (CIPPE) form completed by an Authorized Medical Examiner (Section 1-4)**. If a student has been participating in a fall sport or had the opportunity to have a completed physical done prior to the winter sports season, **he/she still needs to stop in the nurse's office to pick up a Re-Certification by Parent/Guardian Form (Section 5) for the winter sports season**. This form must be completed by a parent/guardian before students are able to participate in a sport. Supplemental Health History questions on Form 5 must all be checked **NO** and the **re-certification form must be completed and turned into the nurse**.

You may obtain a physical form in the nurse's office or download the forms mentioned on the school website. Follow these important steps:

Click on **IHS Athletics**

To the left of the screen...scroll down

Click **Sports Physical Forms**

Select desired physical forms – Section 1, 2, 3 and 4 (for a complete physical) or Section 5 (Re-certification)

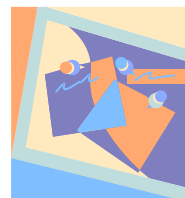

Additional benefits include a 30-day money-back guarantee and a complimentary Norton Security Suite (\$160 value) for comprehensive online security protection.

A household is eligible to participate in the program if it meets all of the following criteria:

- Is located where Comcast offers Internet Service
- Has at least one child eligible to receive a free school lunch under the NSLP
- Has not subscribed to Comcast Internet service within the last 90 days
- Does not have an overdue Comcast bill or unreturned equipment

Comcast will sign up eligible families in the program for at least three years and through the end of the 2013-14 school year. # *Caring Homes Campaign*

## *What Is The Caring Homes Campaign?*

Parents today are concerned about the alarming use of alcohol and other drugs among our youth, as well as the social acceptability. Parents also are aware of the need to help children resist alcohol and other drugs. Young people must be able to feel that it is OK to abstain from alcohol and other drugs. Therefore, it is important for parents to take a unified stand on this issue. You are invited to join the Caring Homes Campaign, a voluntary program sponsored by the Indiana Area School District.

The Caring Homes Campaign is a way that parents can join together to help provide a safer community for their children. It does not require a commitment of extra time or effort for already busy family members. It is simply a public agreement to follow some common sense principles aimed at providing an alcohol and other drug free environment for children. Caring Homes encourages communication between parents and youth and emphasizes a strong parental support network.

Given that youth begin to form friendships with peers who may be unknown to parents, Caring Homes provides a vehicle for establishing contact with other families with whom your child may be associating. It also provides a way to know your child's whereabouts and activities. The goal is to encourage parents to talk with other parents about what their children are doing.

Last year, over 809 families participated in the Caring Homes Campaign, representing 1,336 children and youth. Based on positive feedback and interest, we are offering the opportunity for information to be updated and additional families to be added to this effort.

**If you participated in 2010/2011, you need not submit a new pledge card since we will automatically include you in the directory and generate the grade change of your child. However, if there are any other family changes, please complete a new pledge card (change in address, phone number, etc).**

## *Why Should I Join the Caring Homes Campaign?*

- Joining lets your child know that you care.
- It helps parents establish a clear and consistent "no use" message about alcohol and other drugs.
- Your child should know that you are talking with other parents and that parents have agreed on similar rules and guidelines for their children.
- You will have access to a **Fall 2012** Caring Homes Directory of parents who support this effort.

## *The Caring Homes Campaign Pledge*

The Caring Homes Pledge is not a legal contract. Rather, the Pledge is intended to signify a good faith effort to follow its principles. It creates no legal liability for the Indiana Area School District. Parents do not create any additional legal liability for themselves or their households by participating.

Every adult in the home is encouraged to sign the pledge. Only one form per household is necessary. ***By signing the pledge, unless otherwise indicated, participants grant permission to have all information that they provide listed in the Fall 2012 Caring Homes Directory.***

### *I Pledge to Provide a Caring Home*

Although I will do my best to uphold this pledge, I cannot guarantee the safety of any child or adolescent that is visiting my home.

#### *I will:*

- Provide clear family rules for all children visiting my home.
- Provide a safe storage place for all forms of alcohol and prescription medications.
- Make an effort to inform any parent of a child that I personally observe using alcohol or other drugs.
- Welcome calls from any parent who observes or suspects my child of using alcohol or other drugs.
- Welcome calls from any parent whose child has been invited to my home.

#### *I will not:*

- Knowingly allow parties or unauthorized gatherings in my home when I am not there.
- Knowingly allow illegal drugs in my home.
- Serve minors or knowingly allow youth under the legal drinking age (21) to consume alcohol in my home or on my property.
